Copake Lake Shoreline Clean-Up Day is scheduled for May 27, 2017 (Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend), with rain date of Sunday, May 28, 2017) from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. This event is sponsored by the Copake Lake Conservation Society for the express purpose of removing debris that has accumulated over the winter from Copake Lake and from its shoreline. Copake Lake neighbors are asked to remove debris from the lake and shoreline and place it along Golf Course Road, Lakeview Road and County Rte. 7 up to Julianna/Jefferson Road. Jon Urban of The Greens/Copake Country Club will donate the services of a pick-up truck and maintenance workers, who will drive along the shoreline beginning at 10:00 am, pick up the debris, and dispose of it in the dumpster at the triangle at County Route 7 and Lakeview Road (where we also have the CLCS Community bulletin board). This truck will make ONE trip, starting at 10:00 a.m., from Golf Course Road to Lakeview Road, to

County Route 7 ending at Julianna/Jefferson Road. We encourage residents to bring your own lake debris directly to the dumpster, if possible. Carmen Barbato, Inc. donates the dumpster for the three hours and the Town of Copake pays the tipping fee. Please respect these donations and do not bring any household rubbish to this dumpster. CLCS Board members will monitor the dumpster from 9:00 am-12:00 noon. CLCS 2017 merchandise will be available for sale during those hours at the CLCS Information Booth at the triangle at Lakeview Road and County Route 7. CLCS began Shoreline Clean-Up Day nearly two decades ago and since then we have removed tons of debris from Copake Lake and its shoreline.

## Free Safe Boating Course Offered in Copake

he CLCS has again arranged for a New York State Safe Boating Course to be offered on May 20, 2017, at the Copake Town Hall. This 8 hour course will allow participants to obtain a safety certificate if they successfully complete the course.

To make New York's waterways safer, state law now requires that anyone born on or after May I, 1996, who wants to operate a motorboat, must obtain a Boating Safety Certificate by completing an approved eight-hour course. The new law will ensure that, over time, all recreational boaters navigating New York's waters will have the necessary knowledge required to operate a motorboat safely.

The course is designed as a comprehensive boating course, teaching the fundamentals of safe boating operation. The instructor plans to continue instruction through lunch so please plan on bringing a bag lunch. There is no fee for the class. To register please contact Joyce Craw at <a href="mailto:craw311@aol.com">craw311@aol.com</a> or call 914-474-3786. Provide the names of the registrants and a contact phone number. Register early as there is a limit to the number of participants.

#### **Education Committee**

The new law took effect May 1, 2014, so we encourage you to make sure the young boaters you know have signed up for an approved course. Courses may be completed and certificates obtained through the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, U.S. Power Squadrons or the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. A list of approved courses is available on the State Parks website at www.nysparks.com. In short, a boating safety course is a good idea for everyone, but is mandatory only for those born after May 1, 1996.



#### **Muskrat Love?**

his past winter I think a lot of people were wondering, "What is that clump on the ice and what is that animal?" The clump is called a "push-up" and serves as a resting place and as a protected feeding area for muskrats. Here are some interesting facts:

Muskrats are rodents, joining mice and beaver in that category. They are actually closely related to hamsters. Adult muskrats weigh up to about four pounds versus beavers which can weigh up to 65 pounds. The diet of muskrats depends on what is available in their habitat. Muskrats will eat fish and invertebrates such as insects, snails and clams. However, their main food consists mostly of roots and stems of aquatic vegetation.

While both the muskrat and the beaver build lodges, the muskrat's structure is smaller than the beaver's and is mostly made of plants like cattails. Beaver lodges are made up of large sticks and logs. Both the muskrat and beaver can also make a home by digging into the shoreline. I have seen muskrats going behind my lakefront retaining wall.

The muskrat has a distinct swimming pattern as well. While swimming at the surface, muskrats expose much of their heads and backs. Their long, slender tails have triangular cross-sections and make unmistakable clear cuts through the water.

Fran Martino, well-known local environmental educator with River Haggie Outdoors in Ghent, researched this article and found that the muskrat population has been declining for several years. She cited a Cornell study whereby muskrats follow a 10-year cycle in population fluctuations. The breeding season begins in mid-March with a short gestation period of about 28 days. Get the cigars ready, we're going to have babies!

A big thank you to Fran Martino for her research for this article.



#### **Environmental Canoe Trip: CLCS Members Only (FREE)**

embers of the Copake Lake Conservation Society have been offered an amazing opportunity by Fran Martino, a well known local environmental educator, River Haggie Outdoors, Ghent. On Thursday, August 3rd from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m. there will be a canoe trip at the Greater Stockport Creek Watershed exclusively for CLCS members. We will paddle the Stockport Creek in partnership with NYS Department of Environmental Conservation Hudson River Research Reserve.

Canoes, paddles, personal flotation devices and other gear will be provided by NYS DEC Hudson River Research Reserve. The canoe trip is being offered free of charge specifically for members of the Copake Lake Conservation Society.

This is an ideal trip for novices, and for those who want to learn more about Hudson River fish species found in the Stockport Creek Watershed. We will paddle in the Stockport Creek and its backwaters, and (conditions permitting) journey into the Hudson River a bit. We plan to stop along the way to dip our seine net into the water to see what kind of fish we might find. We'll identify them, and see how they fit into advice from the NYS Department of Health about eating fish you catch from New York State waters.

- Prepare to be knee-deep in water
- Smokers are asked to please refrain from smoking during



#### 2017 Copake Lake Boating Rules And Regulations

Source, New York State Office of Parks Recreation & Historical Preservation (www.nysparks.com/recreation/boating)

**AGE:** Motorized boat operators must be 18 or over. Or, between the ages of 10 and 18 must have completed certified boating safety (NYS Law).

**AGE:** As of May 1, 2014, operators born after May 1, 1996 must have a NYS approved Safe Boating Course and be at least 10 years of age in order to operate a motorboat in New York State.

**BOATING HOURS:** Watercraft must not exceed 6 mph between 8 p.m. and 9 a.m. (Town Ordinance).

**NOISE:** All watercraft must have effective mufflers (Town Ordinance). Watercraft noise must not exceed 75 decibels (NYS Law).

**SPEED:** All watercraft must slow down to 5 mph when less than 100 ft from shore, dock, or other vessel, or in "no wake" zones (NYS Law).

**RIGHT OF WAY:** Motorized watercraft must yield to swimmers and non-motorized watercraft (NYS Law).

#### **SAFETY:**

- a. Personal Flotation Devices (PFD): Children under the age of 12 must wear approved PFD while in a watercraft. Approved flotation devices are required for each person on board (NYS Law).
- b. Water Skiing: Water skiers must have a "look-out" over the age of 10 (NYS Law).
- c. BWI: Boating while impaired or intoxicated subject to fines or imprisonment (NYS Law).
- d. Fire extinguisher, distress signal and anchor are required on ALL motorized watercraft.

#### PERSONAL WATER CRAFT (NYS Law):

- a. Operators must wear an approved PFD.
- b. Operator must be attached with a cut-off device.
- c. Can only be operated between sunrise and sundown and the town ordinance speed limit on the lake is less than 6 mph between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. for any motorized vessel.
- d. May not be operated within 500 ft of a designated swimming area.
- e. Reckless operation prohibited (wake jumping, weaving through traffic, or other maneuvers that jeopardize safety).

**REGISTRATION:** All motorized watercraft must be registered and display the registration numbers (NYS Law).

#### **ENVIRONMENT:**

- a. Help keep unwanted aquatic plants and zebra mussels out of the lake. Thoroughly wash your vessel and flush the cooling system at a location away from the shoreline.
- b. Avoid spilling gasoline or oil. Repair leaks immediately.
- c. Dispose of litter properly in bins on shore.
- d. Do not use soaps or cleansers in or near the lake.

Common sense and respect for others are the way to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone using the lake. CLCS is

not a law-enforcement agency and leaves such duties to the Columbia County Sheriff's Department, The CLCS has posted rules and regulations and distributes these excerpts to encourage lake users to know the rules and observe them.

## CLCS Lake Management Committee Planning for 2017 Season

#### Immediate actions through to end of 2016

- a) Assess 2016 aquatic plant herbicide treatment program.
- b) Decide on 2017 herbicide treatment program.
  - i) Decide on the number of acres to treat in 2017,
  - ii) Determine herbicide to be used= Diquat early, Aquathol later.
  - iii) Estimate treatment date= June 5 or 6, 2017
- Prepare notification of next season treatments for fall newsletter.
- d) Send out fall newsletter prior to Thanksgiving.
- e) Submit application to NY DEC for 2017 season herbicide permit prior to January I, 2017, (include request for copper sulfate), listing number of acres to be treated with map showing locations.
  - i) Include application for second treatment with Aquathol in August.
  - ii) Submit to NY DEC Pre- Post- 2016 Treatment Report Solitude and NEAR.

#### **Actions in 2017**

- f) NEAR/Solitude conduct early spring (March / April), survey to assess growth of milfoil and curly-leaf pondweed confirming suggested treatment areas and date of treatment.
- g) Apply First herbicide treatment.
- h) Monthly monitoring of plant growth, water quality/clarity by NEAR.
- i) Weekly CLCS readings as possible during months of June, July, and August,
- j) Consider application of copper sulfate:
  - i) When water clarity falls below 10 feet
  - ii) When cell density is above 50,000 cell/mL
  - iii) When filamentous algae growth is dense and widespread around the lake.
- k) NEAR conduct initial post-treatment survey 4 weeks after herbicide application.
- Consider a second herbicide treatment on or around August 1, 2017, in the event that native plants become problematic or milfoil re-growth is significant.
  - i) Consider mechanical harvesting if P. strictifolius becomes problematic


