

President's Message


DISCOVERY - Zebra Mussels are in our beloved Copake Lake



hile doing their fall survey of Copake Lake our limnologist discovered zebra mussels in our water. Zebra mussels multiple rapidly and are ranked as the worst invasive species a lake can encounter. Copake Lake Conservation Society asked for folks removing docks and boats from around the entire lake to report back to us if they discovered any in their areas this past fall season. CLCS did receive notification of zebra mussels on various docking equipment from around the lake from homeowners and marinas. Many thanks to everyone who reached out to inform the CLCS of their additional findings. It is very helpful when property owners report any aquatic invasive species (AIS) to CLCS. With the information and pictures the Lake Management Committee collaborated with our herbicide company to come up with a plan to treat for this invasive species. If left untreated zebra mussels will quickly take over our water causing an impact to the eco system along with major operating issues to our watercrafts engines, and more importantly to the safety of our physical bodies as these mussels are as sharp as a razor blade poising a bodily hazard to our skin. The herbicide treatment is extremely expensive, \$75,000 dollars and deemed crucial to protect our lake from being overridden with these invasive species. The infestation will continue to spread at an alarming rate if we do not treat. Unfortunately there are no guarantees that we would not encounter this AIS in the future, but we do know that if we don't do anything the infestation will intensify.

As you know Copake Lake has almost 600 families around the lake and less than half the families are members of CLCS. Meaning as contributors to preserve the lake only an average of 260 families contribute towards the conservation of the lake, protect their property value and their legacy. CLCS relies 100% on their members contributions to fund the ongoing maintenance expenses in preventing Copake Lake from

becoming a swamp. Membership is \$150 a year. This is a very small investment for families to be able to enjoy the gleaming waters of Copake Lake year after year. There are several families that contribute above and beyond. Without their extreme generosity as well as all our devoted members, CLCS would not be able to sustain all the yearly treatments that are needed to preserve the lake. This year we are asking for an additional pledge to your membership donation to help offset the cost of the \$75,000 for the eradication of zebra mussels from our lake.

early, warm spring and delayed treatment timing combined to slam the lake with abundant weeds that were very slow to respond to treatment. Eventually, the lake was clear and life returned to normal. Oops, cannot say normal, because the lake, like life and nature itself is ever changing.

So, what are Copake Lake Management plans for this 2022 year?

ZEBRA MUSSELS

The sudden appearance of invasive, non-native zebra mussels late last summer 2021 threw us a curve. Zebra mussels have been a big problem in the Hudson River for years. It was only a matter of time that bilge water, motor cooling water or a bait bucket out of the Hudson River introduced zebra mussels to Copake Lake. However, it is not only the Hudson River that has become infested with zebra mussels. Owners of all watercraft entering Copake Lake should check to see if zebra mussels are present. So, to fight back, CLCS has contracted with Solitude to treat the lake with EarthtechQZ to attempt to eradicate the invading mussels. The cost will be a whopping \$75,000. The treatment will be done over I to 2 weeks early in the season. We are looking for volunteers to help with monitoring to track how well it works. CLCS will try to put up signs all around Copake Lake so that all individuals launching any watercraft into Copake Lake this season will be aware that the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation strongly recommends the strategy: CLEAN, DRAIN, and DRY all watercraft. MILFOIL & CURLY LEAF PONDWEED

Last year's SONAR® treatment should control the milfoil for a few years, but curly leaf pondweed is an annual weed that needs to be treated every year (see photos of invasive aquatic plants in the centerfold of this issue). Solitude will be using Tribune® contact herbicide early in the season to knock back the curly leaf. NYSDEC stirred things up by requiring limitations on the depth of treatment. Areas less than 3 ft deep may get less weed control than in the past.

Also, the posting will call for the usual I4 day limitation on swimming and fishing in treated waters.

ALGAE

Control of filamentous and/or algae blooms with copper sulfate will be planned with Solitude as the need arises. Watch for

postings and announcements on social media. Lake use is limited for 24 hours after treatment.

HEALTH MONITORING

The lake will be sampled for coliform bacteria in swimming areas in late June, Mid-July and Mid-August. With good septic controls, the lake has not seen any issues for several years.

DAM & LAKE LEVEL

The plan is to have the lake level up by Memorial Day, but as always, the amount of precipitation will determine how quickly the lake refills. NYSDEC stirred things up again when they told us that the annual (100+ years) lake drawdown now requires a permit.

APPEAL

The Lake Management Committee asks everyone to be good stewards of Copake Lake.

Keep your watercraft clean and in good shape and be mindful of runoff and debris from your property. Please give generously to pay for all we spend on maintaining the quality of the lake for your enjoyment.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT 2022

Zebra Mussel infestation was discovered in Copake Lake. The mussels have expanded around the lake and will continue to multiple quickly if not treated. Zebra Mussels disrupt the ecosystem by depleting the plankton that the native species feed on in the lake. Zebra Mussels attach to your vessel's, props, boat engines, and get inside your engines causing costly expenses along with the loss of time using your vessel. The mussel shells can pose a safety issue of cutting your skin.

THE GOOD NEWS:

The Copake Lake Management Committee and Board of Trustees have approved a spring 22' treatment with the goal of getting rid of the mussels however, unfortunately there are no guarantees they will not return as well as any Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).

THE BAD NEWS:

The treatment is going to cost an additional \$75,000. This is an unexpected expense that will most definitely cause CLCS to operate at a deficit in 2022 — we need everyone's support to help address the problem.

THE BOTTOM LINE:

We need to act fast to address this AIS infestation.

Please consider making an extra donation when you renew your 2022 membership. We need your help in keeping the lake clean and free of zebra mussels as well as all other invasive species.

Copake Lake Shoreline Clean-Up Day (June 4, 2022)

opake Lake Conservation Society (CLCS) Shoreline Clean-Up Day is scheduled for June 4, 2022 (Saturday following Memorial Day Weekend), with rain date of Sunday, June 5, 2022) from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

We encourage residents to bring your own lake debris directly to the dumpster, if possible. The Town of Copake contributes the tipping fee for the dumpster. Please respect this donation and do not bring any household rubbish to this dumpster. CLCS Board of Trustees members will monitor the dumpster from 9:00 am-12:00 noon. CLCS 2022 merchandise will be available for sale during these hours at the CLCS Information Booth at the triangle at Lakeview Road and County Route 7.

here are so many reasons you should want to prevent the spread of the zebra mussel aquatic invasive species (AIS) in Copake Lake this summer of 2022. The presence of invasive species (AIS), both plants and animals, makes activities like boating, swimming and fishing difficult to enjoy. AIS can also have serious impact on our lake's ecology and economic value. Once an invasive species becomes well established in the lake, it is very difficult to completely eradicate it. Managing invasive species takes a lot of time and money. Early detection and rapid response to an invasive species infestation makes management efforts much more effective. CLCS will spend \$75,000, in addition to its regular lake management expenses, this spring on a one-time treatment with EarthtechQZ to attempt to eradicate the zebra mussel invasion!

Invasive species are often spread by boats, jet skis, canoes, kayaks, inflatable boats, rafts, and towables that move from an infested lake to a non-infested lake. One of the easiest things you can do to prevent the spread of invasive species into our lake is to inspect your boat for any potential invaders before launching. Some invasive species are so tiny they are difficult to see. In order to prevent the spread of all invasive species, visible and invisible, a thorough cleaning, draining and drying of your boat would help make a big difference. Each one of us at Copake Lake needs to ask anyone launching a watercraft to please inspect their watercraft for zebra mussels. Please see NY Boater's Guide to Cleaning, Drying, and Disinfecting Boating Equipment, hyperlink to this procedure.


Special note to water craft owners on Copake Lake:


Will the discovery of zebra mussels in our lake last summer (2021) change how I prepare to put my watercraft boat back in the water this spring (2022)?

NO. Watercraft that has been stored for an extended period over the winter so that it has been drying and/or freezing do not need to be cleaned, drained, and dried. The zebra mussels will have died over the winter. Be sure to remove any zebra mussel shells from your boat before launching this spring-summer. Zebra mussel shells can still cut the skin of people or pets.




2022 Annual July 4th Copake Lake Boat Parade





NYS Rules and Regulations for Non-Motorized Watercraft (Kayaks, Paddleboards, etc.)

ersonal Flotation Devices (PFDs) must be worn year-round by all children under 12 years of age on any boat less than 65 feet in length, unless within a fully enclosed cabin; by anyone engaging in towed activities, such as water-skiers or wake-boarders; and while on board a personal watercraft. Otherwise, a wearable life jacket must be available for every passenger on board every vessel, including non-motorized watercraft such as canoes and kayaks." New York State Boating Laws and Regulations, 2010, see www.nysparks.com/recreation/boating.

Along with rowboats, kayaks, canoes, and sailboats, paddle boards are considered boats and must have a U.S. Coast Guard approved, properly sized, serviceable, and readily accessible life jacket on board for each person, just like any other boat, mechanized or not. From May 2 through October 31 such persons are not required to wear a life jacket, though it is highly suggested (but they must have one on board and readily accessible).

From November I to May I, everyone on all pleasure vessels which include paddleboards, rowboats, kayaks, canoes, sailboats, and motorboats must be wearing a life jacket while underway, which means as long as the boat is not anchored

or tied to a dock. Drifting counts as underway.

Life jackets are the most important piece of equipment on a boat and can save your life; we recommend that they be worn at all times.

ARE YOU AWARE OF THE NEW NYS BOATING LAW AS OF JANUARY 1, 2020?

new boating law, known as Brianna's Law, went into effect on January I, 2020. By January I, 2025, the new law requires ALL operators of ALL power boats, including electric motors, to take an approved NYS boating safety course. A 5-year phase-in period applies to all operators of all motorized watercraft, including electric motors.

Under this new law, the phase-in period for all motor boat operators will be as follows:

- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1993 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2020.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2022.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1983 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2023.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1978 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2024.
- All motor boat operators regardless of age will need a boating safety certificate beginning on January 1, 2025.

Fines of between \$100 and \$250 will be imposed for failure to comply under the new law that took effect as of Jan. I, 2020. The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, which administers the law, estimates that there are nearly one million boaters who will have to take the boating safety course before the completion of the phasing in on Jan. I, 2025. Further information on this law and classes can be found on the following website: https://parks.ny.gov/recreation/boating/education.aspx.

As a reminder, Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's) are required to be worn by, and securely fastened to, any youth under the age of 12 on boats 65 feet or less in length (NYS Nav. Law Section 40.1(d)). PFD's are also required on every

pleasure vessel including canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, and rowboats operated upon the waters of NYS. You must have on board one U.S. Coast Guard approved wearable PFD for each person on the watercraft. In addition, vessels 16 feet and greater in length must also carry a type IV throwable PFD.

2022 Copake Lake Boating Rules And Regulations

Source, New York State Office of Parks Recreation & Historical Preservation (www.nysparks.com/recreation/boating)

AGE: Motorized boat operators must be 18 or over. Or, between the ages of 10 and 18 must have completed certified boating safety (NYS Law).

AGE: As of May 1, 2014, operators born after May 1, 1996 must have a NYS approved Safe Boating Course and be at least 10 years of age in order to operate a motorboat in New York State.

BOATING HOURS: Watercraft must not exceed 6 mph between 8 p.m. and 9 a.m. (Town Ordinance).

NOISE: All watercraft must have effective mufflers (Town Ordinance). Watercraft noise must not exceed 75 decibels (NYS Law).

SPEED: All watercraft must slow down to 5 mph when less than 100 ft from shore, dock, or other vessel, or in "no wake" zones (NYS Law).

RIGHT OF WAY: Motorized watercraft must yield to swimmers and non-motorized watercraft (NYS Law).

SAFETY:

- a. Personal Flotation Devices (PFD): Children under the age of 12 must wear approved PFD while in a watercraft. Approved flotation devices are required for each person on board (NYS Law).
- b. Water Skiing: Water skiers must have a "look-out" over the age of 10 (NYS Law).
- c. BWI: Boating while impaired or intoxicated subject to fines or imprisonment (NYS Law).
- d. Fire extinguisher, distress signal and anchor are required on ALL motorized watercraft.

PERSONAL WATERCRAFT (NYS Law):

- a. Operators must wear an approved PFD.
- b. Operator must be attached with a cut-off device.
- c. Can only be operated between sunrise and sundown and the town ordinance speed limit on the lake is less than 6 mph between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. for any motorized vessel.
- d. May not be operated within 500 ft of a designated swimming area.
- e. Reckless operation prohibited (wake jumping, weaving through traffic, or other maneuvers that jeopardize safety).

REGISTRATION: All motorized watercraft must be registered and display the registration numbers (NYS Law).

ENVIRONMENT:

- a. Help keep unwanted aquatic plants and zebra mussels out of the lake. Thoroughly wash your vessel and flush the cooling system at a location away from the shoreline.
- b. Avoid spilling gasoline or oil. Repair leaks immediately.
- c. Dispose of litter properly in bins on shore.
- d. Do not use soaps or cleansers in or near the lake.

Common sense and respect for others are the way to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone using the lake. CLCS is not

a law-enforcement agency and leaves such duties to the Columbia County Sheriff's Department, The CLCS has posted rules and regulations and distributes these excerpts to encourage lake users to know the rules and observe them.
